CROP FORECAST

What is the compass you use to show you the path for conducting your business in a successful way? For some it might be clients' feedback, for others maybe it is economic analysis. Well, those are important information sources, however since we are a coop, let us discuss over a key indicator for us, which is:

For most of our member's water spring are the main source of water, and for many of them the only one. Some farms have several of them while others have just one. With this in mind, one of our first worries when we improved our environmental approach were them. After doing lots of research about ways of protecting water springs we got to the conclusion that we should use a simple and efficient method that could be easily learned by our members.

In order to broadcast our intent, several meetings took place at different communities in our working area in order to execute one spring protection as a practical lesson for members who live in the neighborhood. This is how we got to make our members become aware toward the importance of protecting their water sources. But what about the protection itself?



Well, and why is this number so important? Here are the main reasons:



In order to offer cheaper credit to our members it is necessary to know how much coffee they are going to produce. This way we will not allow our member to get in debt more than they can afford. In general, this is 30% of their production;

Both her father and grandfather used to work with cattle and coffee, both of them at small quantities. She got married very young, at the age of 17 and in 1993 she divorced. That was when she had to take the lead at farm activities. At that time, she didn't know anything about managing a farm. And then she learned everything herself.
