About other wastes, like used cooking and machine oil and electronics, our town counts on a hub for these items.

Finally, regarding used tires, due to our ecological cesspool project, we rarely get to find them in the warehouse set aside for it. Actually, it is common that growers have to drive to nearby cities when they need to build a new cesspool.

Of course there are challenges regarding other wastes, like oil filters, but our sustainability department is already looking for an alternative. The most important action in this whole subject is improving our member's awareness toward the importance of good environmental practices. This is an endless work in the direction sustainability and COOMAP is committed to it.

In the most visited departments, like coffee department and the store, there are specific boxes where our members deposit used batteries and small electronic devices, like cell phones. Furthermore, COOMAP has a place dedicated to receiving used light bulbs and expired medicine. For these wastes and batteries, our co-op pays a specialized company to pick up this material and provide a proper destination to it.

When it comes to empty agrochemicals containers, an association was created and a warehouse was built for this specific purpose. In fact, its new warehouse has just been built. Thus, not only co-op members but all of producers can count on this hub.
